Tact.* 4, 9. 42. 45.— Written also δρόγγος. *Martyr. Areth.* 53. [Compare throng, and the Gothic driugan = στρατεύεσθαι.]

δρούγγος or δρούγος, ου, ό, Celtic, = μυκτήρ, ρώθων. *Epirh.* I, 416 B. *Tim. Presb.* 13 B.
